1. The races were made on the standard mile course without the use of stakeboats. The water was choppy. The weather was clear and ideal for a race. The shells had to go against the tide.

2. There were two races. The first pitted G.W.'s 2nd shell, W. & L.'s 2nd shell, Frances Hammond's 1st shell and Navy's 2nd and 3rd shell against each other. All shells started at a fast 40 stroke with G.W. taking the lead and settling down to a 34, holding between that and a 35 the entire race.
