- The Course: 2000 meter course with markers at 500 meter intervals on Severn River
- The Plebe Race: Princeton started off at a 35-36 stroke and settled to a 34, which it maintained for the body of the race. Navy settled to a 32-33 and never had the lead. At the 500 meters mark Navy was half a length behind, at the 1000 a length, at the 1500 a length and a half, and over two lengths at the finish.
- The Junior Varsity Race: The J.V. race was the highlight of the Lightweight races. Navy took the start, settled to a 33-34 and remained with a slight lead until the 1000 meters mark. Princeton rowed at a 35-36 stroke throughout the race. At the 1500 meters mark Princeton pushed into the lead, but Navy was walking on at the finish. Princeton won by less than a deck.
- The Varsity Race: Princeton took the start and remained in the lead for the rest of the race with a 36-37 stroke. Navy rowed at a 34-35 and power tens could not shorten the lead. Princeton's high and effective stroke and Navy's lack of good timing resulted in a Princeton victory.

 2. The Plebe Race: The Varsity Lightweights race was the second race of the day due to the weather (heavy wind and tide up course). Navy took the start and easily pulled into the lead rowing 40 and then 34. Despite adverse conditions, Navy continued to increase that lead. Shortly before passing the 500 meters mark open water showed between the boats. By the 1500 meters Navy had over four lengths and had dropped the stroke to a 3J. At the finish Navy was eight lengths ahead and did not take a sprint.
 3. The Junior Varsity Race: Conditions had improved at the start of the J.V. race, but were still bad enough to adversely effect the times. Georgetown seemed to be left behind in the spray as Navy increased its lead from three lengths at the 500 meters, to six at the 1000, to almost ten at the 1500 meters, and over twelve at the finish.

 4. The Varsity Race: The Plebe race was the last race of the day and followed the example set by the previous Navy crews. Navy exploded at the start and moved progressively into the lead. At the 500 meters mark Navy was ahead by a length, at the 1000 by two, at the 1500 meters mark over four and over eight lengths at the finish. The Plebe victory gave Navy a clean sweep in the Regatta.

3. The Junior Varsity Race: With races staggered with heavyweights, the JV's rowed at 1045. Harvard gained three seats at the start and settled to a 34½ with Navy at a 35. Navy moved even at the 800 meters and had a 2 seat advantage at the bridge (1000 meter mark). Harvard again moved into a 3 seat advantage, rowing stroke for stroke at a 34 with 500 meters to go. Harvard started its sprint with 40 strokes to go and Navy followed three strokes later. Rowing a 36-37, Navy moved with every stroke and won by 4 seats. It had been the first time a Harvard boat, Varsity or JV, had 4. The Varsity Race: been beaten in over three years.

The Varsity race was not as fortunate for Navy. In a borrowed lightweight shell and with a slight breeze from the starboard side the set up was not firm. Navy lost four seats to Harvard's Stempfly at the start and settled high at a 35½ (34 being the goal for this race). Harvard moved and had almost a length at the 1000 meter mark. Navy appeared to shorten in an effort to catch up, but was unable to catch the 34½ stroking Harvards.

- The Course: A 2000 meter course heading downstream on the rain swollen Schuylkill River, with a dog leg 700 meters from the start into a 15-20 knot wind.
- The Plebe Race: None.
- The Junior Varsity Race: Using what its crew calls a "gumby" start, Navy took the lead and stayed out in front in the first thousand meters. Thanks to coxswain Mark Cavallo's skill in negotiating the bend in the river and to a timely power ten under the Trolley Bridge, Navy moved out ahead over a length. By the last 500 meters Navy was close to a length and a half in the lead. Sprinting on the last 20 strokes, Navy stretched that lead to two lengths at the finish.
- The Varsity Race: At 1515 the Varsity race began with Navy in the middle lane at a 42; settling to 33 into the heavy chop. The crews were even at about the same stroke through the 500 meter mark when Navy started to move. Navy had 3/4 of a length after straightening out at the 700 meters and continued opening at a 32-33 throughout the race. A slight (36) sprint was used to give Navy two lengths at the finish. The race for second wasn't decided until the last 20 when M.I.T. came on to beat Penn.
