- The Course; The race took place on Princeton's Lake Carnegie. The course was 2000 meters with markers at 500 meter intervals.
- The Plebe Race:
- The Junior Varsity Race: Navy drew lane three for the race. Navy came out of the stake boats at a stroke of 43. Princeton took a two seat lead at a stroke of 44. Navy rowed the body of the race at a stroke of 33. At 1500 meters the stroke had fallen to a 30¹/₂ and was taken up to a 33 for the last 500 meters. Princeton outstroked Navy for the body of the race at strokes between 33 and 38. Princeton continued to gain on Navy and at a high stroke won the race by two lengths. Rutgers finished well behind Navy at a stroke comparable to Princeton.
- The Varsity Race: For the varsity race Navy drew lane two, Princeton was in lane 1 and Rutgers in lane three. For the start Navy was at a 42 and Princeton at a 43. Navy settled to a 40 and Princeton to a 41. For the body of the race Navy was at a 33 and Princeton at a 36. Princeton continued to gain on Navy until the 1500 meter mark. The margin continued to hold to 1¹/₂ lengths, as Princeton tried a 500 meter sprint to the finish. Navy lost a hard-fought race by 1¹/₂ lengths, finishing well in front of Rutgers.

1. The Course: The course was 2000 meters in length and was marked at 500 meter intervals. The course was on the Potomac River at Washington, D.C. All starts were conducted as floating starts.

3. The Junior Varsity Race: The junior varsity race was run between the Potomac Boat Club and Navy. Georgetown does not have a junior varsity crew. The race was very close and there was some question as to whether Navy received unjust guiding on the race course turn. Navy was in lane one with the Potomac Boat Club in lane two.

After several starting problems, the race got underway with Navy and the Boat Club stroke per stroke. The race remained neck-in-neck until the turn.

4. The Varsity Race: when the Boat Club took the lead. For the Varsity race Navy was in lane two with the Germans in lane 3 and Georgetown in lane one. Navy started at 41 and the Germans at 44. Navy and the Germans were neck-in-neck for the first 500 meters and then Navy began a steady push. At a steady racing stroke of 34 Navy continued to slowly ease out. At 1500 meters the sprint began. The Germans stopped Navy's advance but, Navy held the margin to win by 3/4 of a length.

- The Course: The course was on the Severn River. It was 2000 meters in length marked in 500 meter intervals. All starts were conducted as floating starts.
- The Plebe Race: Harvard sprinted ahead as the Plebe race began. Battling rough water the Plebes attempted to overstroke Harvard but, to no avail. Harvard rowed the body of the race at a 34, while the Plebes were at a 36. Harvard finished ahead by a length.
- The Junior Varsity Race: The JUNIOR Varsity race was also run in very choppy water. During the first 500 meters of the race the 5 man developed trouble with his slide and the Navy team was severely handicapped. After Navy recovered all Harvard advance was stopped, yet an unconquerable margin had been established. Both Navy and Harvard rowed at a 34 and were stroke per stroke for most of the race.
- The Varsity Race: Navy could not seem to stop Harvard in the Varsity race. Sprinting from the start, Harvard took a slight lead. The race was very close until rough water was encountered at the 1000 meter mark. Harvard edged out on Navy and finally gained a length margin which was held for the finish of the race. Both crews were at a stroke of 35 for the body of the race.

The Third Varsity race was run in better weather the previous day. The race was very close until the final strokes when Navy edged out to win.

- The Course: The course was 2000 meters in length marked in 500 meter intervals. All starts for the Lightweight races were floating starts.
- The Plebe Race: The Plebe race was extremely close until the last 500 meters in which M.I.T. sprinted and was able to hold their $\frac{1}{2}$ length margin.
- The Junior Varsity Race: The Junior Varsity race was started twice due to difficulty in Navy's JV after 25 seconds of the race. The second starting of the race was about 300 meters down the course. Battling choppy water at a stroke of 35, Navy blazed down the course to obtain a length and $\frac{1}{2}$ over M.I.T. Navy was able to hold the margin and won substantially.
- The Varsity Race: Due to the terrible weather, the original race was cancelled and postponed two times until Sunday morning. Originally Pennsylvania was scheduled for the race in the Callow Cup Regatta, however, due to academic problems Pennsylvania left prior to the Sunday morning regatta.
 For the first 700 meters, the Varsity race could have been given to Navy or M.I.T. Both crews were very close in stroke. Navy lost almost a length as the body of the race progressed. However, Navy showed tremendous stamina as they began to gain on the M.I.T. boat and pass them. Navy maintained a slight margin to win by .4 seconds.

- The Course: The course on Lake Quinsigamond was 2000 meters on a well marked interval.
- The Plebe Race: Navy had problems in the Plebe final. The Navy team was off to a poor start. They were stroking 34. They continued to lose ground throughout the race and placed sixth. The wind conditions in Navy's lane were atrocious.
- The Junior Varsity Race: The JV also got off to a poor start. The wind was strong and variable, giving the coxswain little control of the boat. The margin lost by Navy in the final race was never regained. They stroked a 33 for the body of the race. The poor showing by Navy in the JV race can be attributed to the terrible weather and water conditions.
- The Varsity Race: After a postponement of 45 minutes due to Harvard shell problems, the Varsity race also got off to a poor start for Navy. Navy fought back in a tremendous effort to regain position, but could not pass the three leading crews. At a stroke of 34 for the body of the race, the crew appeared awkward for the final 1000 meters. The weather played an important role in the problems suffered by the crew.
